Pre-K Preparation

Many parents wonder what they can do to help their child have a happy and successful year in Pre-Kindergarten.

The following are ideas to set your child up for a successful transition to school...

- reading to your child daily
- sitting/listening/ participating in activities: 10 minute intervals (not TV or screen time...think table activities or sitting in a church service)
- recognize first name (capitalize first letter, rest should be lowercase)
- listening to and repeating nursery rhymes
- naming shapes, colors, letters, and numerals
- listening and following two-step directions
- carrying out responsibilities at home (setting table, cleaning up toys)
- sharing and taking turns
- sticking with tasks until they are completed
- snap, button, zip, take off and put on clothing/coats/shoes without help
- caring for personal hygiene...independently taking care of bathroom needs and washing hands
- orally counting to 10 or beyond
- conversation skills, practice not interrupting
- keeping up with personal belongings
- opening snacks independently, practicing table manners and cleaning
- praying daily with your child
- limit screen time to special occasions
